LOVERACING.NZ Pony Scurry Information Sheet

<u>Riders</u>

Aged 10 - 16 years as at 30 September 2025. Riders must be <u>under 17</u> to compete at all events.

<u>Pony</u>

- Mount can be up to 148cms or 14.2h any full height pony requires an RAS height certificate.
- All mounts are to be aged 4 years and over.
- All Thoroughbred and Standardbred Pony entries must be entered with their racing name included and/or breeding if unnamed for racing or brands provided if unknown.
- Any Thoroughbred or Standardbred Pony entry must not have raced or been in race training within the past 6 months.
- Any Thoroughbred Pony entry must be showing as retired on LOVERACING.NZ.
- Any Standardbred Pony entry must be showing as retired on hrnz.co.nz.
- Every Thoroughbred and Standardbred Pony entry must provide a current RAS height card as proof of 148cm or under.

<u>Gear</u>

- A GP or Jumping saddle to be worn no track or racing saddles.
- Ensure your girth is not on the top holes when you are doing up.
- A bridle to be worn with a bit please use a bit that you are comfortable in stopping your pony in.
- A breastplate is recommended.
- Martingales, nosebands etc all OK.
- Boots can be worn if necessary but must be well fitting and taped.
- NO whip to be carried.
- NO spurs to be worn.
- NO bandages, bellboots, studs allowed.

<u>Rider</u>

- Light coloured jodhpurs short or long boots and chaps all OK.
- Helmet current standard.
- Back Protector not required to be red tagged but to be racing or PC standard and well fitting.
- Long hair to be tied up and tidy.
- No piercings small simple studs only in ears.
- The colours/silks you wear are provided on the day, as is a numbered saddle cloth this goes over your normal saddle cloth you use.
- Please wear tidy attire on course, this can be your riding attire you will be going to the grandstand and meeting trainers and jockeys before the scurries.
- Covered toe shoes. No gumboots please for the meet and greets.

<u>General</u>

• Please bring a filled hay bag/net and a bucket for water.
